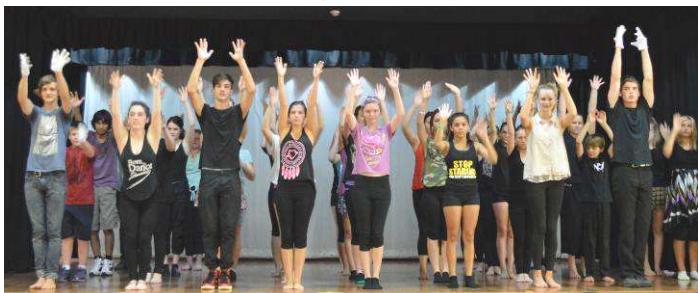
## KINGARROY STATE HIGH SPORTS NIGHT
